- 8:40 9:15: Discussion (35mins):
 - ACTION ITEMS from last meeting:
 - The last meeting was held September 26 prior to municipal elections, to thank elected officials who
 were retiring and those running again, for their service to communities and working together in this
 Forum.
 - Meeting Notes:
 - Laura Patrick: Trust may function better this time
 - AO: And motion to the province, was that discussed?
 - LP: Ran out of tank time, pushed it back to March.
 - Think that the motion to the province and the ask for more money were misconstrued.
 - AO: FN not unlike local governments. Seeking funds.
 - I've always thought the most important relationships are those between your staff, administrative resilience,
 - Tim Peterson: This Wednesday, will meet with MUNI Minister Kang.
 - Understand they are coming with an agenda
 - Paul Brent
 - AO: Discussed this with my sister, the only govts notified of a requirement, but not given funds, are FN
 - It is a requirement of the Islands Trust to notify the 24 FN
 - It is a foregone conclusion that the IT can charge for an application
 - FN can't charge. Frustration on behalf of a local government, when an application goes in and 28 days later they ask for money to process it.
 - Applications languish, province takes money, but application sits there. Dock applications wait for ages. Some constits say if its a capacity issue with FN, then they'd pay that fee too!
 - Dag Falck: Has this been explained to the local govts?
 - I believe if a problem is identified then the important thing is communicating

- AO: This has been discussed for 10 12 years. Provincial government is well aware.
 - There is a variety of reasons this has hung up.
 - I wouldn't think the prov would be surprised.
- Paul: I understand FN is working on a protocol agreement with BC Ferries. Big docks.
 - I think its an important point that waterfront areas are of critical importance to FN.
 - Sometimes I wonder that for every little thing, 24 38 referrals to FN, that it is incredibly inefficient.
 - You should be able to have some things, like a setback into an incursion, that don't trigger referrals.
- AO: Understanding staff needs between bureaucracies an important aspect of consolidating / streamlining if pursued. Difference between FN notable
 - Also imperative that staff have a functional relationship. Understanding each others needs, etc.
 - CRD / IT staff have a relationship with Province, the same should be with FN.
- Laura: Tiny homes on wheels.
 - Cowichan councilors are banding together to have a position on tiny homes on wheels.
 - Is there a desire to create a position?
- AO: Every time I take this to the BC Govt they say build it.
- Paul Brent:
 - We're enforcing against them.
 - CRD and IT seem to work together to enforce against tiny homes
 - We're doing our best at the CRD to try to convince CRD to convince province to lay low on enforcement.
 - We've got situations that are totally unacceptable.
 - On one half, a housing crisis, and a province booting people out of homes.
 - Its insane.
- AO: I agree.

Deb: A couple things:

- With zoning, we need a defined thing that they are, and that the code allows the basic of health, fire safety, etc,
- That is my reluctance to approve RVs, which are what they are currently zoned as. I won't go ahead with RVs, as they pose living hazards
- Tiny homes, if built appropriately, then we could clearly say any building built to this code is zoned for this area. It would allow us to do a lot of stuff I would love to do
- It is not affordable housing Victoria style, because that is NOT happening on Pender as long as I'm here
- Don't want to zone for RVs, opens the door to things I think are unsafe
- Dag Falck: Interesting discussion.
 - For me its clear, the manufacture of tiny homes are already purchased with the stamp of approval from the building code.
 - Its zoning, and things like composting toilets. You can't put in composting toilets because of zoning or building code.
- Paul Brent: You can use a composting bag, but you have to dispose of solid waste, likely off island
 - Reality is we are facing a housing crisis, many people are living in RVs, etc.,
- Laura Patrick: We have a local advocate who is quite passionate.
 - The only way they're regulated is as RVs
- Deb Morrison: We have an affordable housing crisis, and a unique context, and we need the feds and province to work with us and not push back
- Laura Patrick: I will forward you a pilot from Adam created for the return of David Eby
- Morrison: I would zone stuff next fricking meeting if we could get something to point to

- Paul Brent: Lets forward that out to everyone
- AO: Lets hit more than the municipal affairs minister. Ravi Kahlon has been given a mandate, and he is going to be looking for creative solutions
 - I've met with Selina Robson, with others, and they say just build it.
 - Currently, if the difference is 4", then the difference is 4". The
- Deb Morrison: And not just you sending it Adam, and no offense but I think the local officials is the way to send things
- AO: Well no offense taken, I completely agree.
- Kristina: Can we take this to the trust council? Would it have more weight there
- Morrison: I would say no, because the Trust Council is the Islands Trust Act, but we should have the LTCs list
 it
- Kristina: I think we're asking for a change with how to do land use bylaws, which falls under the Trust Council
 - If we're looking for new fed/prov building codes
- Paul Brent: If we have 21 local trust committees signing on, its just as good as
- AO: I think it is in the end a function of the relationship between the local govt body and the Trust body is best, adds a ton of weight.
 - Indicates to the province to push a way forward.
 - I will continue to advocate this to Ravi Kahlon, even if meeting with
 - Not to go too far ahead, but for our next half day meeting it has been proposed we discuss housing.
 I am for that.
 - As we look forward to January, if there are any issues feel free to send them to Laura Parker, and we can begin to research it.
 - Of course recognizing that if anything comes up, don't wait until next month to talk about it.
 - Anything else for anyone to bring up in their first months?
- Gaugreau: How glad I am I came to this meeting, very informative.
- AO: Yes, well we use this to keep in touch with the council and
- Deb: Other things I've run against, transportation: Ferries, The Dip, preservation issues, helicopters I hate helicopters, the port authority is in this vein,
 - Then I don't know, Paul, can you think of things?
 - We're having a back and forth with one person here.
- AO: The water surrounding the islands is one that will easily slip through all of grasps, but our constituents will rightly point out it is all of our concerns
- Deb: I like that you just used the language of the act. People talk about advocacy and I dislike the word advocacy because it points to us having no power.
- AO: Dip is being fixed.
- Paul Brent: Last I heard it is being addressed end of January
 - And we're not going to forget about water are we Adam?
- AO: In BC, connecting any more than one house to a system requires a utility
 - In AB, you can have up to 15 units attached to a system and not require a utility
 - We had, Jake in my office, 5 ministries in a meeting, and it came down to Island Health enforcing provincial regulation which requires any more than 1 unit collecting rainwater to have a utility
 - Despite it being a method used across the world
- Kristina: But single families can use water catchment for single family use.
- AO: One way it could start is having funding from the govt to have built materials for these systems
- Deb: Paul I'm interested in discussing that with you
- AO: Contact Laura Parker

- Laura Patrick: Just to plant some seeds. The obvious answer is to move to a service under the CRD, and a
 regional service with SSI and the Gulf Islands, not just SSI.
 - A watershed protection, and a water provision.
 - We tend to separate water
 - CRD has their integrated water service, which is exactly what you're talking about
- AO: Well I like that idea, I can talk about that
 - Like I say with the islands when they say we're all unique, yep, uniquely the same.
- Adam calls the IT kids
- Dag Falck: I appreciate this forum, and I deeply miss at the Trust Council level having a conversation to just start things off. Even in this short little hour, so much information and pieces of the puzzle. Very valuable.
 - Thank you for allowing this kind of form
- Deb: And just to be clear, nothing personal Adam, its not just Adam and his staff, its the Islands Trust and we fought for funds
- AO: Two things, I am a believer in discussions, and there is money remaining in the budget.
 - So before the half day we will need to decide on how to proceed.
- Deb: It would help us to know when the date is before Trust Council, increases the opportunity for us to get funding again.
