- Issue(s) to work on:
 - Dag: any update on the DIP on Pender?
 - Adam: I was to meet w/Mike Pearson prior to Xmas but had to cancel due to snowstorm

 so meeting this aftn. Will also be getting info. re: SSI and review of road safety and improvements on all islands with MoTI ACTION ITEM
 - Kristina: clarification of ALC applicant has put something in process is long why and what can we do?
 - Adam: it is an independent body, so it will take as long as it takes but our office can inquire/nudge to help it along. Have constituent contact our office.
 - Elizabeth: Anchorages and Derelict boats
 - Bill C33 new power to the Minister to direct on anchorages
 - And emphasis on Indigenous consultation
 - I encouraged Ben McConchie & alliance groups to come to Ottawa to testify
 - Laura: issues in Ganges Harbour on liveaboards
 - Elizabeth: yes, bring these forward –even contacting media that it is an issue to Ottawa sees there are issues
 - Gary: huge undertaking for local govt to step in should be a local management person/office available for people to connect with – properly managed it is a good source of housing
 - Adam: has been issues with Min of Forests responsible for foreshore leases –
 Central Saanich & Tsartlip band put in to manage mooring bouys, etc. in Saanich
 inlet. Is an issue in Tsehum Harbour too agree that Feds have authority but not
 managing

- District of Central Saanich and Tsartlip met at UBCM to talk about lease so machinations going on re: the whole issue – needs more proactive response Federally.
- Elizabeth: W/budget in the Spring expect to see new registration mandates for recreational vehicles – creation fund to get derelicts out of waters
 - asks that Trustees help push for this
 - Adam: Elizabeth & I met re: derelict vessels we are in the planning stages of having a press conference - ACTION ITEM
 - **Gary**: (put in chat) "The 3 municipalities on the peninsula have established a shared harbour service but does not extend into management could provide a framework, but liability a key constraint."
- Elizabeth: COP15 dramatic strong language on Canada
 - Laura: provided this info but was not discussed in this meeting: "Congress Takes Action
 <u>To Elevate Puget Sound Recovery</u>" Dec 20, 2022 The Nature Conservancy ACTION
 ITEM
 - "Washington state leaders in Congress who have been working for years to advance Puget Sound recovery efforts. [In December]... Key provisions of the PUGET SOS Act passed - recognizes Puget Sound as a nationally significant body of water - establishes a Puget Sound Recovery National Program Office within the EPA - codifies the Puget Sound Federal Leadership Task Force, an agreement between nine federal agencies and cabinet..."
- Gary: Has a way forward on tiny homes been clarified?
 - Paul: need moving forward progress on Tiny House solutions as Housing is #1 issue. Thought there was a group getting together?
 - Laura: Deb and her were going to f/u on this to draft an approach for full time residential use - ACTION ITEM
 - Adam: Laura Patrick & I met on this BC govt tells me they can build them I've requested mtg w/new Min. of Housing, Ravi Kahlon, to discuss also new Min of Municipal Affairs, Anne Kang ACTION ITEM
 - Paul: I'd like trailers allowed, liveaboards, expand-work around to provide more and affordable housing - is massive problem
 - Adam: he's asked Premier Eby re: housing as a human right yes, he agrees it is
 - Laura: RIEP conference in April to discuss rural issues. We need to have a housing strategy in our area
- Adam: Fallow Deer is an issue high on his radar will be mtg w/Min. Cullen re: biodiversity is opportunity of prov govt. He will engage his father whose been working on this too ACTION ITEM
 - Jeanine: CRD has stepped up to work on this as well

- **Gary**: (put in chat) "CRD is establishing a service to manage geese in the region but have not included (and should) deer."
- Adam: was on SSI on Friday met with nurses very concerning issues with their working conditions, short staff, overtime he has a call in with Island Health
 - **Elizabeth**: she's met with and helped with fundraising for emergency department agrees it is critical situation will need more nurses and housing for them as well
 - Paul: agrees health issues critical throughout our district
- Jeanine: Swartz Bay Ferry terminal concern back up of traffic when very busy safety traffic control need to have permanent flaggers. Happens at other terminals as well
 - Adam: agrees has been in contact w/BC ferries he raised issue as impacts on all the islands – he suggested that there be separate ferry for building materials and trades people
 - He also brought up inequity of cost for Galiano
 - Ben: used to have a resident's card (~30+years ago?) there are all sorts of alternative to deal with this
 - Paul: (put in chat) "Maybe BC Ferries may equalize fares by doubling fares from the SGIs to Swartz Bay!"
 - **Gary**: (put in chat) "BCF now considering allowing commercial vehicles on dangerous cargo sailings on Crofton-Vesuvius sailings."
 - Adam: all on his radar and will continue to raise it with BCFerries
- Laura: found out from Emcon that MoTI used to contact people re: their driveways into road –
 they are no longer doing so
 - **Ben**: agrees it would be nice if Emcon would take care of the roads, so we don't have these issues.
 - Adam: when writing to MoTI on these issues they want to hear how contractor Emcon is doing and when issues - Cc my office on this as well
- Ben: of course all issues cost money we need to prioritize to get things done
 - Adam: agrees as so much going on and we'll all keep working together
 - I am holding Community meetings this March would like to host with Gary and Paul so can bring up provincial and CRD level issues with Constituents.
 - Please everyone keep an eye out for dates we will be on your island. Perhaps in the future we can hold joint meetings with Island Trustees.
